Again, you earn 10 points for 1st, 6 for 2nd and 4 for 3rd place winners. You also can win 8 points each for best species or best miniature. Anyone bringing in a plant receives I point for each plant brought to the show table and registered. Remember, our goal for 2015 is to get 100% participation.

Q. Coconut Chips

I am having good luck growing my orchids in coconut chips. Should I be using a balanced (with a 1-1-1 ratio) fertilizer or a high-nitrogen fertilizer (3-1-1 ratio) as for fir bark? — J. Jameson

A. Coconut products are being used, both as chips and as a ground material that has a consistency like peat moss, as potting media for many genera. In discussions with several growers, notably Terry Root of The Orchid Zone, it seems that coconut-husk products are composed mainly, if not entirely, of lignin, rather than cellulose. Lignin requires many more steps to break down than cellulose, the main constituent of wood and bark products, and so would not appear to be subject to the same wood-rot bacterial action that is the reason higher-nitrogen formulas are required for bark culture. In other words, a balanced formula will be best. Coconut products have the added benefits of being a renewable resource as well as being the last remaining unused portion of the coconut. — *Ned Nash*

JUDGES CORNER - AOS Awards - part 2 of 3 "Quality Awards"

Continuing on from where we ended in part 1, we look in detail at the AOS Quality Awards. The purpose of judging quality is to reward superiority and extraordinary orchid flowers rather than recognizing commonplace characteristics. There are three quality awards but each are judged by the same rules. The AOS has a "Quality Scoresheet" based on 100 total points for perfection.

Plants are evaluated by a judging team both at monthly judging center meetings and at any AOS sanctioned orchid show. Judges examine nominated plants for their prominent characteristics and if deemed significant, a plant will be scored. A plant may be judged for more than one type of award. Once judged, nominated, or displayed at a show, no plant can be re-judged until a new flowering. All plants exhibited at a show are deemed "been judged" by the AOS once judging has ended even if never pulled for judging. At any time an exhibitor may ask to have their plant judged.

The AOS quality scoresheet is divided roughly into thirds then subdivided into individual attributes. Points in the scoresheet do vary from orchid alliance to another and there is a "General" category with no attributes which allows the most flexible point distribution between the three main sections. Plants are scored on "Flower Form", "Color of Flower", and "Other Characteristics". Even a plant which is scored based on superior flowers will be evaluated for overall plant quality under the "Other Characteristics" section.

Once awarded, the quality award designation is carried forever with that plant. It is a permanent part of its name. For example: Brassocattleya Sunset Glory 'MoJo' HCC/AOS is the official name of a plant which has received a Highly Commended Certificate from the AOS. That is not to say that all Brassocattleya Sunset Glory 'MoJo' have this designation only the awarded plant, its divisions or its clones own this name.

PLANT AWARDS

HCC (Highly Commended Certificate) - 75 to 79 points on the Flower Quality Scoresheet.

AM (Award of Merit) - 80 to 89 points on the Flower Quality Scoresheet.

FCC (First Class Certificate) - 90 to 100 points on the Flower Quality Scoresheet.

Next month in part 3 we will take a closer look at the AOS Cultural awards.
